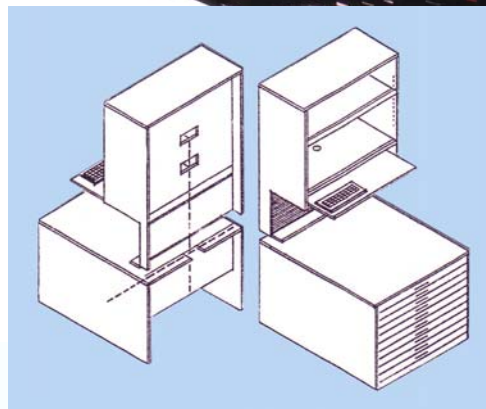


## **Imaging Production Center at The New Yorker**

This computer-driven scanning and graphic production area, designed by Mancini Duffy for The New Yorker Magazine, includes a multi-function “technology wall”. Modular in construction, it houses monitors, keyboards, CPUs, an oversized light box and flat file storage. A unique cable management system, built into the rear wall of the cabinetry, is easily accessible through hinged panels.

**The oversized light box, specially built to specific size and brightness requirements, is flush with the work surface. Slide-out keyboard/mouse supports are suspended under the overhead monitor shelves.**
